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**DUMBO** Reflected On A Parisian Canvas

If you take a walk through DUMBO today, chaices are you'll run into Michelle Auboiron. She's hard to miss. But it's not Auboiron herself who's so noticeable, it's the oversized canvas be-fore which she stands, painting the glo-nous bridge visits alforded by that area.
